Development Update

Heritage Prairie is very happy to announce that both the wind and solar projects remain on track in Kankakee and Livingston Counties thanks to the support of those involved with the projects, including our incredible group of over 230 landowners. Our team would like to sincerely thank everyone involved for continuing to support the projects through these irregular and often difficult times. We've been encouraged by the public response so far through one-on-one conversations with residents and local stakeholders. In the first half of 2021, we will finalize the project footprint and begin the local permitting process.

Economic Recovery

Heritage Prairie is proud to be developing a project that will help rebuild the local economy following the difficulties many experienced in 2020. The project is anticipated to inject hundreds of millions of dollars of capital investment into the local area, creating hundreds of high-quality construction jobs as well as many long-term full-time employment opportunities. The project will provide long-term, stable revenues to all local taxing jurisdictions including schools, fire departments, road districts, libraries, and county budgets. The project will also support local farmers and landowners by paying long-term lease payments for all participating landowners.

Supporting Local Causes

Heritage Prairie was proud to be a Skyrocket Sponsor of Kankakee Valley Park District's 4th of July Fireworks show in 2020 and to donate to the Food Pantry serving Dwight and Round Grove Townships in Livingston County. We look forward to continuing to support local organizations in 2021 and beyond!

Responsible Land Use

Both Heritage Prairie Wind and Solar have signed Agricultural Impact Mitigation Agreements (AIMAs) with the Illinois Department of Agriculture, to ensure that all construction, operations, and decommissioning activities are performed to the highest standards, and done in a way that preserves the long-term use of the land for agricultural activities. In addition, the projects will sign road use agreements with all townships and counties to ensure that any road used in association with the projects will be fully restored to its initial condition.

Open House

In 2020 before the pandemic began, we hosted a series of open house events to provide the broader project community with information about the project. While current gathering restrictions limit our ability to hold large gatherings, we are planning multiple online open house events in the coming months. Stay tuned for invites!



IL State Supports Clean Energy

In 2020, IL state legislators worked hard to begin building Illinois' clean energy economy by rolling out ideas for a clean energy roadmap to achieve the State's goal of reaching 100% clean

energy by 2050. Industry News

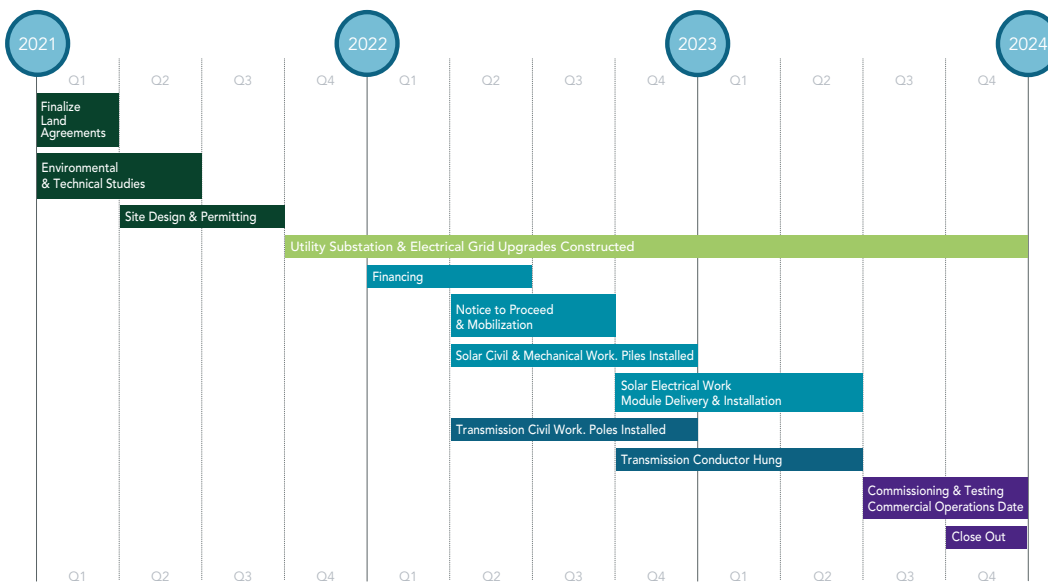

Safety

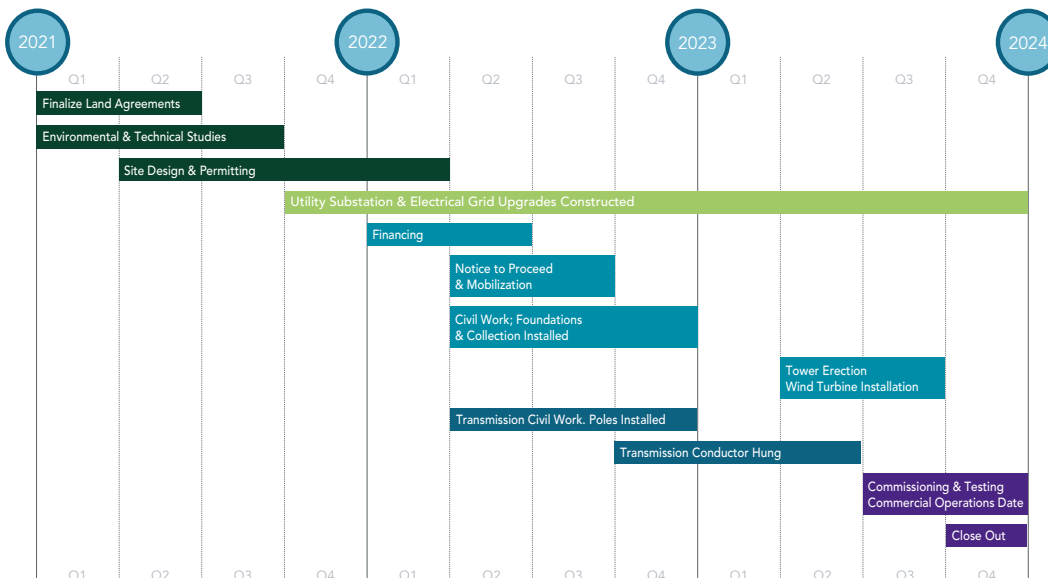
All Heritage Prairie staff and land agents working on behalf of the project are committed to the safety and welfare of the community. We suspended in-person meetings during critical periods of the pandemic. Pattern and its contractors will continue to comply with the mandates and recommendations of the local and state government officials. Currently, we are holding in-person meetings if requested by Landowners. When in-person meetings do occur, we restrict the number of attendees to no more than 6 and require that our agents wear appropriate protective equipment and follow best practices as outlined by the CDC.
